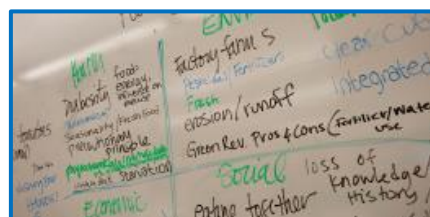


Apply now: International Training Course on Organic Agriculture, 2018
